

sound is the North East of Scotland's festival of new music. Following a pilot event, "Upbeat" in 2004, the first festival was launched in November 2005, and has become an annual event.

sound aims to make new and contemporary music more accessible to audiences of all ages and backgrounds by presenting an eclectic but very broad range of contemporary music - classical, traditional, popular, jazz, experimental - through a wide range of events including concerts, talks, electroacoustic installations, and workshops.

sound, an initiative of Woodend Arts Association in collaboration with the University of Aberdeen, operates largely as a network of local organisations. The 2007 network also includes Aberdeen Chamber Music Club, Aberdeen City Music School, Banchory Academy, BBC Scottish Symphony Orchestra, Belmont Picturehouse, Capella Nova, Duff House, Gordonstoun School, Interesting Music Promotions, Inverurie Music, the Lemon Tree, Monymusk Arts Trust, Music Hall, Newton Dee Community, North East of Scotland Music School, Strathdee Music Club, Upper Deeside Music and Woodend Music Society.
