Welcome to soundfestival 2023

For the first time in a while, this year's festival doesn't have a specific theme, but the piano and the voice are featured, alongside some exciting new instrumental and electroacoustic work performed by both local and internationally-renowned performers.

We welcome back pianists Rolf Hind and Christina McMaster. Rolf will perform pieces he commissioned during lockdown and join Robin Michael for a celebration of music for cello and piano, including music by the late much-missed John McLeod, while Christing will create spaces for deep relaxation and listening with her Lie down and Listen concert experience. Commissions involving the piano include Colin Riley's new work for piano, film and live visuals, Ludic Inventions, and Christopher Fox's Earth and Sea for piano and percussion.

Chamber Choir Ireland and soprano Elizabeth Hilliard will make their festival debuts, and we welcome back Lucy Goddard to sing passages from Nan Shepherd's *The Living Mountain* in James Weeks' work *Plain Air*.

Our local chamber choir Con Anima will perform new work by emerging composers as part of our **sound**creator's strand. And if you'd like to sing too, you can take part in our Community Singing Day!

Watch out for Red Note Ensemble performances throughout the festival, including a commission from Norwegian composer Tine Surel Lange as part of a Scandinavian co-commissioning project, as well as premiering FLOCK, Kathy Hinde's multimedia work for children. They will also spotlight emerging Scottish composers as will our local new music ensemble Any Enemy.

There is so much more we haven't mentioned, so have a browse and we look forward to seeing you soon!
