At the core of *Night Vision* is a large body of text written in a semi-conscious state during the night over a two-year period. Some of the text was later developed as a script/score for several iterations of the work – album and live performance, with a film and publication in development.

The ensemble performance has a flexible form, and unfolds as a contemplative, dynamic voice sound work that crosses territory between concert, theatre, and live art.

Nichola Scrutton is a composer/sound artist, vocalist and artist. Recent projects include Night Vision 2022-23 (Creative Scotland), Dream Stream commission for Radio Art Zone, European Capital of Culture, Esch 2022; Interzone album released on Nonclassical label 2023; Lying Over Under Another sound artwork/performance with writer Zoë Strachan as recipients of a Second Life Award from the Edwin Morgan Trust 2023. Nichola was awarded a practiceresearch PhD in 2009 from University of Glasgow (AHRC).
